Sitting in a trendy Brooklyn café and eating french fries, Charli XCX leans back in her chair and quietly says, “I’m going to build an empire.” It’s a pretty lofty goal, but the 22-year-old pop star says it so matter-of-factly that you instantly believe her. Of course, there’s no reason for her *not* to be so confident—she’s already well on her way! See, what you may not realize is that Charli has been the mastermind behind some of the biggest (and catchiest!) girl-power anthems of the past few years. She cowrote the Icona Pop hit “I Love It” and Iggy Azalea’s No. 1 song “Fancy” (which her voice is also featured on). WHEN DID YOU KNOW YOU WANTED TO BE A STAR? My dad's an actor, and he took me on location once when he was shooting a film. One benefit of a superbright color? "It shows up in the dark," says Richards, who prefers an orangy red. "It's bold but somehow friendlier than a classic Fifth Avenue red." Follow these tips so you don't look clownish: "Hydrate lips first so lipstick glides on evenly," Richards says. (She likes Lucas' Pawpaw Ointment, \$13.) Then, for a softer look, pat a matte coral lipstick, like Tom Ford Beauty Lip Color in True Coral, \$49, onto lips with your fingers. You know to skip eyeshadow with a strong lip, but don't neglect your brows. "I wear a tinted brow gel, and—this is key—I groom them with a clean mascara brush to blend it for a natural look. No clumps."

smoky eyes

A dark eye is sexy, striking and goofproof. "It's the easiest thing to do, because you don't have to be exact," Richards says. Start with a black kohl eyeliner pencil, like Rimmel Soft Kohl Kajal in Jet Black, \$4. Swipe it along the inner and outer rims of lids. "This really defines your eyes," Richards says. Then apply a matte black shadow (like Jouer Powder Eyeshadow in Licorice, \$20) to your lids with a dense, dome-shaped shadow brush. Blend it up to the crease and swipe it along your lower lashes, too. "But I avoid the inner corners," Richards says. "Dark shadow there makes my eyes seem too close together." Last step: mascara on top and bottom lashes.

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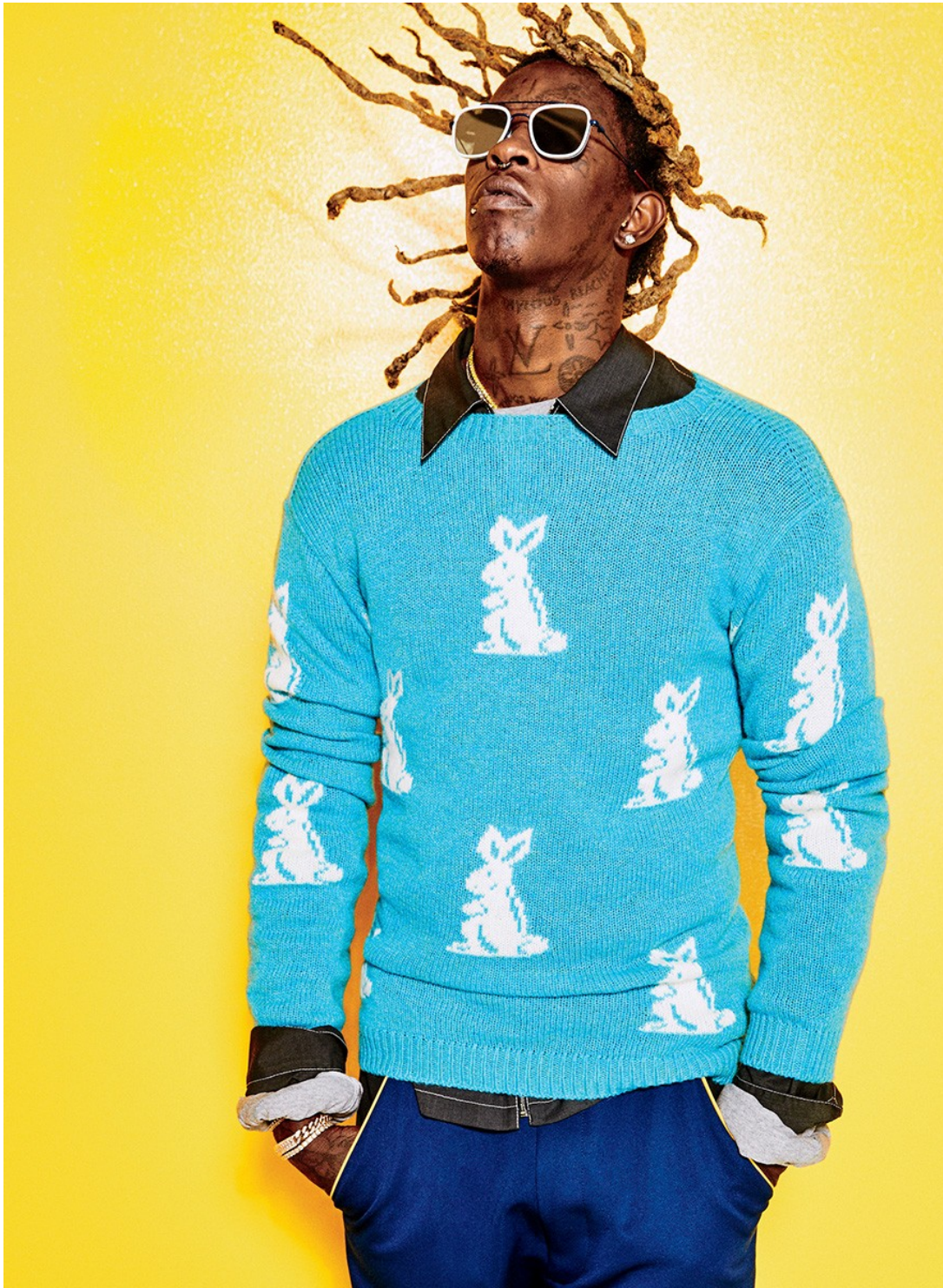

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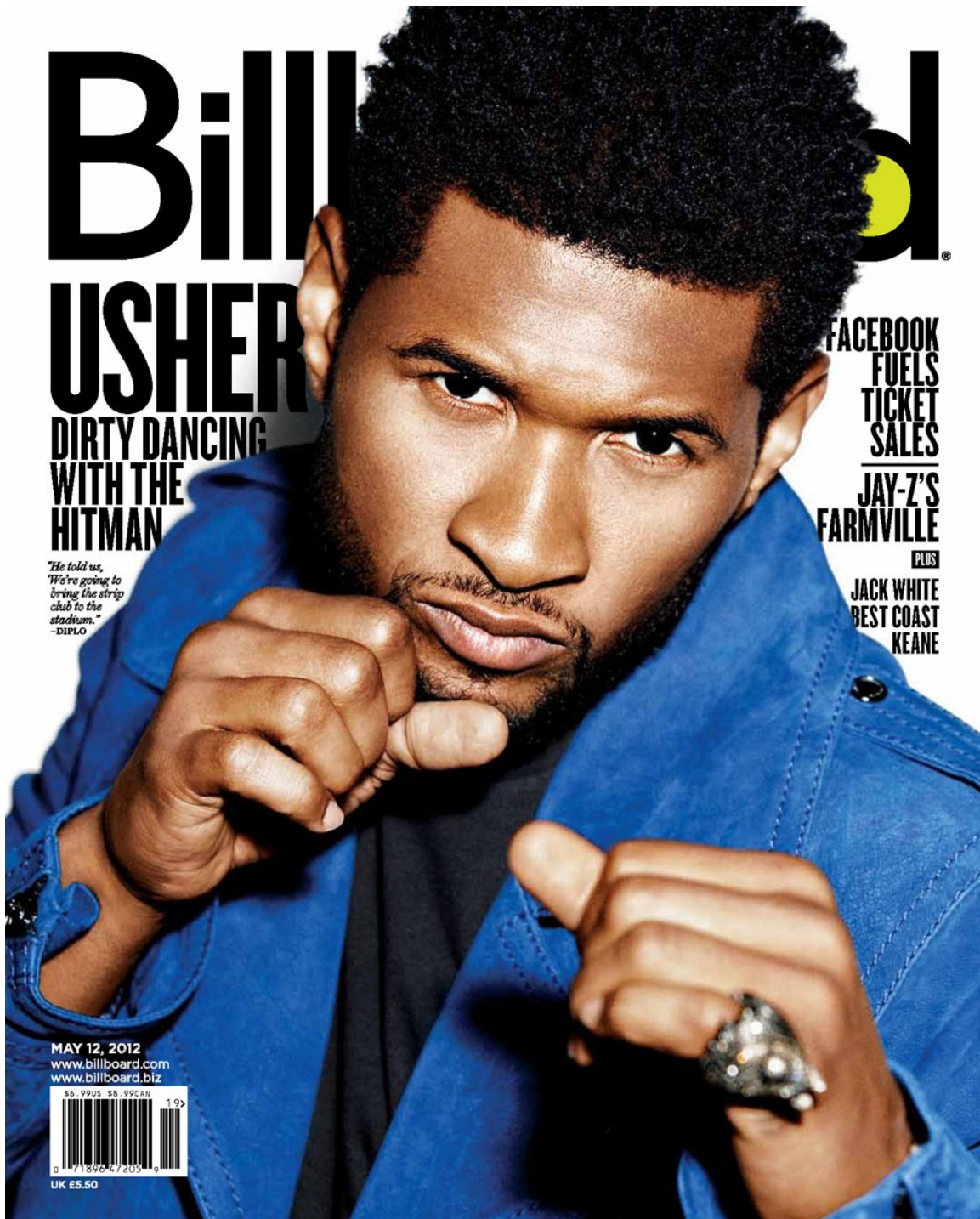

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LOOKING FOR THE

PERFECT BEAT

Putting together what may be the album of his career, Usher had epiphanies at Coachella and on Ibiza that inspired him to reach out to new listeners without leaving his core audience behind

KALE SALAD, STEAMED SPINACH. Lean protein—or, frankly, no hormones or antibiotics. No sugar. No carbs. It may sound like the latest celebrity torture diet, but Usher's catering requests for his Billboard cover shoot come not from vanity but necessity: He must trim down from an already chiseled 176 pounds to the welterweight of 160 pounds in preparation for the role of Sugar Ray Leonard in the Roberto Duran biopic *Hands of Stone*, with Garl Garcia Bernal and Robert De Niro. This also helps explain his spontaneous hooks and jabs on set today in front of the camera.

The boxing training has clearly seeped into his consciousness. In talking about his seventh album, *Looking 4 Myself* (due June 12)—a fusion of electro-soul, old-school R&B and modern club anthems both Usher and his label, RCA, feel will expand his music and his audience—the pugilist metaphors come easy: "It's all about striving for greatness and offering the best I have. It's no different than a boxer: Standing in front of the person trying to tear his head off, he has to give his all to make it out of that ring."

Here's another then: Consider Usher in fighting shape to defend the belt he reclaimed during the last two years. *Looking 4 Myself* sounds like it may be the album of his career, and it follows his expansion into the international dance

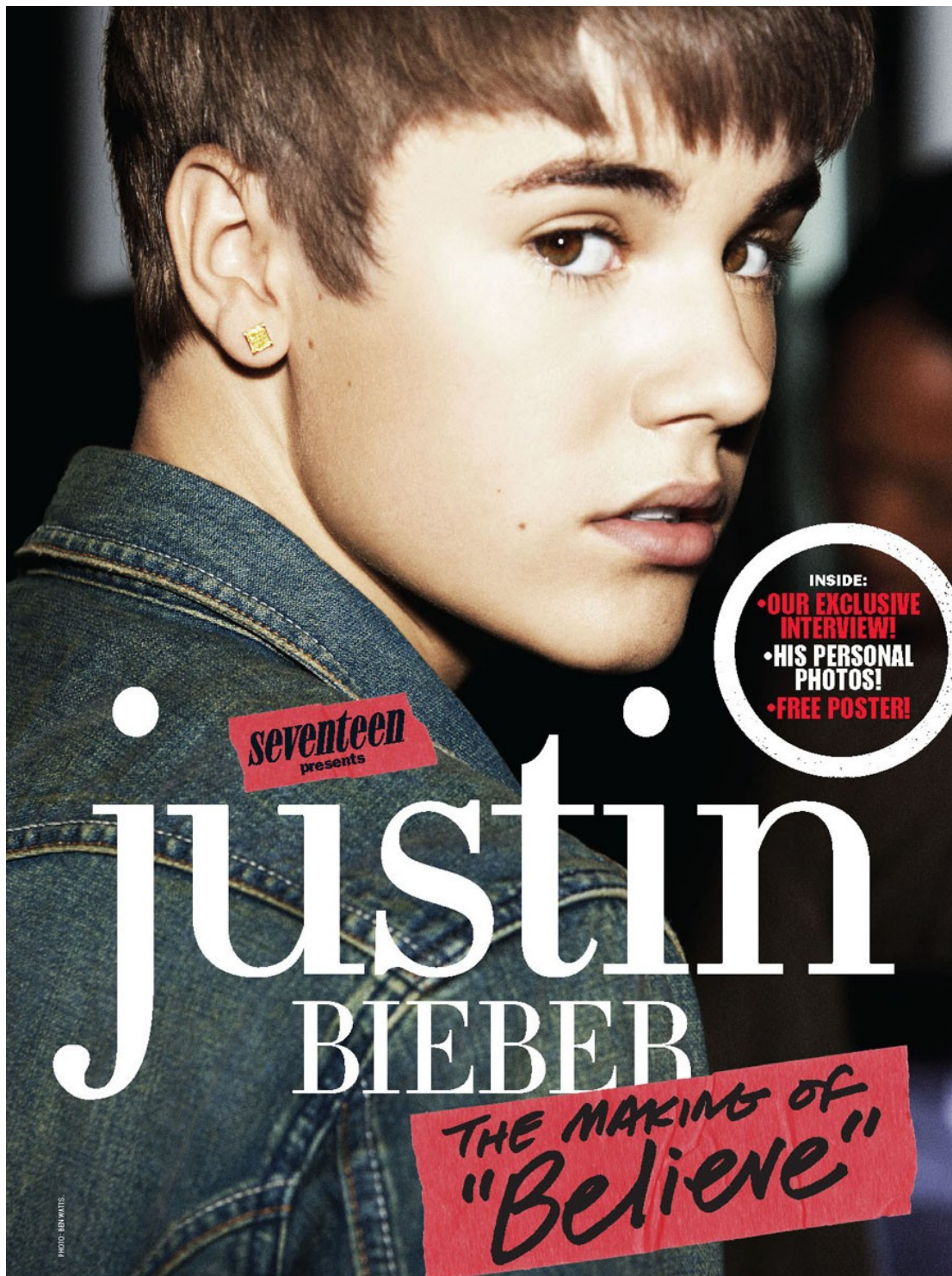

On the cusp of releasing his new album, JB is working harder than ever—connecting with his fans, developing his sound, and proving he's not just a cute kid anymore.

ou can hear Justin Bieber coming long before you see him. That's because he doesn't just walk up the steps to the second-floor music studio where he's been recording his new album. He sings the whole way. And trust us—his voice is just as strong without all the music production. Unplugged, he sounds soulful and real.

When Justin finally appears, he's in a black T-shirt and jeans with a checkered Louis Vuitton belt holding his pants up against his gray American Apparel briefs. He's wearing an orange Philadelphia Flyers hat that's sideways on those famously sideswept bangs, and he has matching orange soles on his black Supras. He's also wearing a large gold Jesus pendant around his neck. "My boy, Jesus," he says, petting it and pronouncing the name with a Spanish accent.

After only a few minutes of talking to him, you realize there are two Biebers. "I don't think I do anything that's starlike," he says shrugging, as he waits for his turkey dinner to be delivered from Boston Market. Throughout the conversation, the 18-year-old can barely sit still—"Concentrate!" his manager Scooter yells at him as Justin gets up to hunt in the fridge, checks his iPhone for texts, fumbles with his hat, and shakes out his bangs. He's more than happy to talk about his favorite TV show moment (it's a
