Jon Hamm's Hair Isn't Full of Secrets—It's Dry Shampoo

Here, we caught up with four stylists—plus, the men they make glow—to hear more about what goes on behind the scenes when guys get ready for the cameras. From the TMI (nose hair trimming) to stuff that'll truly make you jealous (La Mer regimens), these routines might not be fraction of what most of us go through on a given day, but they sure are fascinating.

Groomer Kim Verbeck, 46, and actor Jon Hamm, 45, started working together long before Don Draper was even a thing. "It was 2006, on an *Interview* magazine shoot, and *Mad Men* hadn't yet debuted," says Hamm. "Kimmy has been 'my people' ever since."



"I remember the third time we worked together," says groomer Marissa Machado, 33, of Bleed for This actor Miles Teller, 29. "It was for 21 & Over, and I came in the room and said, 'Nice to see you,' and he goes, 'So, are you, like, my girl now?' "That was four years ago, and she's still by his side, cutting hair, blotting shine....

GLAMOUR: Do you two ever peruse Getty Images and think, Nailed it!

Miles Teller: The Oscars [in 2015, for Whiplash]. Dug it.

Marissa Machado: Oh my God, yes! But that was a stressful situation. It was Miles' first time attending, so he had a few nerves, as did I! We had a few disagreements, a slight panic, but in the end we worked it out: structured hair—a big movie star moment.

GLAMOUR: Any red-carpet hacks? Self-tanner a yes or no?

Rami Malek Is a Glowing Snack With Flawless Foundation at the 2019 Oscars

Makeup artist Marissa Machado breaks down the Best Actor champion's *olef's kiss* perfect red carpet complexion look.

The 2019 Oscars may mark the end of awards season, but it also definitely confirms the fact that people really, really liked Rami Malek. He went from being lauded for being a rechisive backer in Mr. Robot to being lauded for being one of rock music's generate legends for his potrayal of Freddie Mercury in biopic Bolomiar Rhapoudy (also nominated for Best Picture at the Oscars). The dude has range, and thusly he's been up to his cyclalls in nominations and wins, scoring a Golden Globe for Best Arcor in a Duran, again for Behamiar Rhapoudy.

Now that Malek's face is becoming more of a red carpet familiar, that face is getting the red carpet treatment. Like all dudes wearing variations of the same usit to various awards shows, they want to look flawless for the photo pit, and that's where men's goomens come in. I asked Machado how she and Malek come up with a least for events like awards shows and press tours, to which she mentioned that they both agree that adding a bit of warmth to his skin is the move. 

Do your friends tell you you're 'celeb obsessed'? Do you follow your favorite celebs' every move? Know their Instagram histories so well that you can rattle off their inner circle by name and 16 handle? If yes, Ellin Delly's new series, SideClique, is just for you. If you've ripped out pics from a magazine shoot of Nick Jonas in the last decade, chances are that you're already familiar with the grooming work of Marissa Machaola. After first assisting another men's groomer working with a thengrowing sensation colled the Jonas Brothers, she has been behind youngest brother Nick's comera-ready looks since he was 15.

Consistently working with both Nick and Joe Janas, celebrity ments groomer Machado also counts Bohemian Rhapsady star Rami Malek and Diny John headliner Eric Bana as some of her clients. Her responsibilities focus on preparing male celebrities' hoir and skin for public events, junkets, and photo shoots. But as with anyone aspiring toward big Hollywood dreams, Machado paid her dues before becoming a top groomer. While hustling for industry connections, she attended cosmetology school and worked at a Nordstrom makeup counter, jumping at any special opportunity that arase.

"One day I got in at an agency on an assisting job and then I was just doing different gigs here and there," Machado soys. "I was asked if I wanted to assist another men's graamer called Catherine Furniss. My agent soid at the time lithat the client! was this boy band that he's kind of heard of (and) they're called the long. Better "

Up to date with her celebrity news, Machado had an inkling that the band would climb toward success, and her career clicked into place after she began to work with the brothers. While taking care of their touring looks and grooming them for talk show and magazine appearances, her name began to stand out within the film and TV industry. "From then on out, I just started working with men and that's how people sort of knew me in the business, so I just went with It," she says. "And "ms a happy that I did."

After following the Jonas Brathers through their Disney heyday, Machada grev particularly clase to Nick offer the fric split is 2013. We've all been in her shoes before, but Machado's text snafu had a happier ending than most of our mistakes probably have. "He said, "You know what, Marissa, dan't worry about it, it's rude, I feel bad."

The internet is still reeling from Jonas' double dose of wedding ceremonies with new wife Priyanka Chopra, but before the couple's big day(st). Machado always knew that fans could expect to see the groom rock a classic Jonas look. As seen in photos from the wedding festivities, Jonas sported a beard and the short, voluminous hair that still hints at his waves of yesteryear. Ahead of the wedding weekend, Machado also groomed her friend for his appearance alongside Chapran at his fest distillative are his flows.

"He knows what he wants, he always has a clear vision, and it's really nice because sometimes we collab, sometimes he leans on me, but sometimes it's just, "Hey, this is what I want," the groomer shares. Speaking to Elite Daily about two weeks before the wedding, she was confident that Jonas' look on his big day wouldn't be too surprising to longtime fans. 'It's fun, it's different, I get to meet people, I never get bored. I know it's not luck because I did have to wark really hard to get here, but my dad always sold, 'Luck is the definition when appartunity meets perseverance.' I think that's definitely true here.'



Conceal blemishes, fight shine, and more

Brands like <u>Chanel</u> and <u>War Paint</u> are placing bets that <u>makeup</u> is going to become mainstream for <u>men</u> in 2019.

Tioned moisturizes are the most heavy-duty of the three products, with coverage that's comparable to that of a foundation, but with added 5PF and moisturizing qualities. Apply any of the above on clean skin or on top of a moisturizer and below with fingers.</u>

Hide and heal breakouts

Treat blemishes as you conceal them: <u>This occuping</u> from Evolution Man uses salicytic acid to help dissolve dead skir cells, unclog pores, and neutralize blackheads and whiteheads.

Warm up dull skin

After a workout, you might have a redder complexion due to all the blood flow your body managed while you trained. For these moments, Machado likes to apply bronzers to give skin a glow and dispulse red cheeks. This goes from Tom Ford doubles as an oil-free, soothing moisturizer that calms irritation and "mimics the look of a few minutes in the unit," she says.

Thicken sparse hairs

For her male clients, Machado often focuses on the brows. She reaches for a brow filler like <u>this one</u> from the Boy de Chanel line, since it gathers itself around each hair and makes them thicker and bolder. It can also be used to spruce up any patchy or grey spots of facial hair.

We spoke to the celebrity groomer Marissa Machado to see how she achieved Malek's Academy Award-winning look



ast night was big for Rami Malek, Scooping the coveted Best Actor award at the 2019 Academy Awards, he is the first Arab man to do so and his rise to Oscar glory has been meteoric.

Now cementing himself as certified Hollywood royalty, Malek has perfected his dress sense with ease (and the guidance of celebrity stylist llaria Urbinati) and for the 2019 Academy Awards he enlisted the help of Marissa Machado to perfect his look.



Working with the likes of Nick and Joe Jonas, Joe Alwyn and Zachary Levi, Machado has firmly become one of the best male groomers in Tinseltown and she has been on hand throughout awards season to give Malek a helping hand.

With that in mind, we spoke to Machado to see how she achieved an Oscar-worthy look, from what products she used to what she recommends he does post-Oscars afterparty...

GQ: How did you achieve a winning look for Malek?

Marissa Machado: "When I saw Rami's tux, I knew that we needed to keep him looking like the handsome leading man he is, but with a slight edge. We gave him a traditional side part in his hair but with a flair of a cool edge. To touch up parts of his face to even out his skin tone, I used the EXI Delete Fluide Concealer in shade 5.0 (£10.50. At Boots. boots.com). It's great because it provides a full-coverage finish, is super for blending and is great for giving a more even tone. I then continued to perfect Rami's complexion with the EXI Inviswear Compact Powder in 4.0 (£11.50. At amazon.couk), a powder that features EXI's signature yellow-gold pigments, which is perfect for Rami's olive skin tone.

"To keep his glow nice and warm, I used the Kosas Tinted Face Oil for a natural, sun-kissed warmth and finished off the look with Kosas Sport Lip Fuel, a great universal balm to keep lips hydrated for both men and women.

"At the end, I used a folded tissue (in lieu of blotting papers) to dab any excess shine and sweatiness away. It's way more discreet and easy versus blotting papers."

What products did you use on the night?

"EX1 Cosmetics Delete Fluide Concealer in 5.0, EX1 Cosmetics Invisiwear Compact Powder in 4.0, Kosas Tinted Face Oil and Kosas Sport Lip Fuel. I'd recommend

What products favour him best?

"Anything that adds warmth to the skin. I just really love to have his skin glowing and warm - I never want him to look washed out. EXI is really great for skin tones like his. The pigments in the concealer and the powder are spot-on matches for him, making his skin look fresh and even."

How would you describe his skin?

"Rami's skin is a beautiful olive hue, but with the winter months it's important for me to keep it hydrated and also to even out the tone. The EXI and Kosas products I used at the 2019 Oscars helped do that, creating the natural feeling of warm, sun-kissed skin by evening out the skin and giving it a very natural-looking finish."

I'm sure he celebrated heavily last night - do you have any advice for post-Oscars skincare?

While it's true that the bride tends to get the most attention on the wedding day, it's important to remember that there are two people getting married. That swhy the groom deserves some serious TLC. too. In addition to picking out wedding-day attire that makes you feel great, one important decision you'll need to make as the groom is whether or not you want to walk down the aisle with facial hair. Experts agree that there's no right answer. Some men prefer to be clean shaven on the big day while others think it would be strange to do away with their everyday style.

To decide what's right for you, you should first think about how you want to look—both in real life and in photos that you'll reference for many years to come. While the choice is entirely yours to make, most style experts agree that the groom should try to look the way he normally does. That means not growing out a beard just for this occasion or shawing for this one day only. "If the groom's facial hair is part of his usual appearance then there is no reason he needs to shave it for his wedding? says Madeline Korosec, men's grooming merchant at https://discrete.org/like/the-best/version-of-herself. if the groom's facial hair is part of his identity and makes him feel confident, then he shouldn't make a drastic change for the big day, unless he wants to herself.

<u>losh McBride</u>, entertainment host and lifestyle expert, agrees, adding that a groom should consider what he's most comfortable with. However, if the groom does decide to keep facial hair, McBride recommends taking proper care of your beard or mustache in the months leading up to the celebration. Here, professionals share their best grooming tips for men planning on keeping their everyday facial hair for their wedding.

Enlist the help of a good barber or stylist.

If you don't already have a good barber or stylist on speed dial, now is the time to get one—
even if you know you're going to ultimately opt for a clean shave. "An experienced and skilled
barber will ensure that you have straight sideburns that will look great for all those pictures
you will be taking—not to mention control over your facial hair to eliminate any unwanted
waves or shapes if you do have a beard," says Esquire's grooming expert Rob Diaz.

Get a facial.

If you've never had a facial in your life, this is time to start. In fact, Marissa Machado—the celebrity groomer who was responsible for helping Nick. Jonas prep for his wedding to Priyanka Chopral—suggests getting your first facial about three months before your wedding, then returning for follow-up visits every 30 days or so. 'Getting a basic facial is a great way to clear out any blocked pores, get the circulation and blood flowing as well as hydrate your skin,' she says. 'It can really make a positive difference in your overall appearance—plus, it feels amazing!"

Wash your face regularly.

Believe I to r not, but you should be washing your face twice daily—once in the morning and once at night before bed. Doing so helps clean out pores, even skin tone, and prevent breakouts. This is especially important If you have a beard, as oil, dirt, and grime can more easily get trapped near the hair follicles. Korosec suggests looking for one that removes dirt and oil without drying you out. If you have a beard, you'll want to follow your wash with a beard oil, which Machado says should be applied with a comb to help pull loose strands through.



How to Get Justin Theroux's Tousled Hair and **Beard Style**



Our January cover star frequently changes his appearance. Justin Theroux routinely teeters between clean-shaven and bearded, as well as slicked back and intentionally disheveledwith a few bestubbled and tousled stops along the way.

Of all his looks, we know Theroux best for his textured, mussed hair, paired with a neatly manicured beard, full as it can be (as seen in our photo shoot with the actor and screenwriter). There's toughness to this combo, and versatility. You could mimic it for the office without having to restyle for happy hour. You could match it with a leather jacket for a night out, or a wool blazer for brunch with the in-laws.

If you're looking to flatter Theroux and mimic the look—and why wouldn't you?—here's some advice on how to do it best. All expertise comes from LA-based celebrity groomer Marissa Machado, whose clients include Nick and Joe Jonas, Rami Malek, Liam Payne, and more.

"This hairstyle works best on fine, straighter hair," says Machado. "Straight, weightless hair is more likely to stay standing up (with the product you apply). A heavier head of hair would wilt

If your hair is wavy or curly, however, fret not: Machado says you could quickly straighten it with a flat iron in order to replicate Theroux, (Try Sedu Revolution Styling Iron.) It's also suitable if your hair is thinning, since it errs on the side of disheveled and "imperfect".

"You can use the sides of your hair to push forward, therefore masking a receding hair line," Machado says. "Plus, thinner hair is usually weightless, which will hold up easily (with the styling product)."

Should you use a barber or stylist?

Machado says you can visit either the barber or a stylist for this cut, since it's halfway between the two spectrums. She just warns that you need to use scissors all around—even on the tighter sides—so don't let your barber click on their clippers unless it's to clean up your

How much they cut will be determined by how much hair you have. You should get some texture cut into the top, which will be significantly longer than the sides. It's easily replicated on shorter hair too, though you won't get as much vertical unless the top is a couple inches

First, Machado says to spray some styling tonic (try V76 by Vaughn Tonic Hair & Scalp) or sea salt soray (try Sachajuan Ocean Mist Spray) into clean, towel-dried (but lightly wet) hair. This will assist with the volume, and make the hair more receptive to the next product you apply.

"Next, blow dry using your fingers for a rough, choppy finish. Make sure to dry the hairs atop the head in an upward direction, using your hand to push the sides forward." This can cover some of your hair recession. (We like Conair 1875-Watt Pro Styler.)

it's dry and in place, grab some matte pomade (like Byrd Matte Pomade). A penny-sized

"Make sure to get it into the root and evenly around," Machado says. "Use your hands to perfect the shape. Once you've done that, lock it in place with a light setting spray."

The spray won't make hair brittle and hard, but it will preserve your style for the day.

How to maintain the beard

"Keeping a beard this length—clean but burly—is actually more work than it looks like,"

It's manageable, even though you'll need to trim it every two days, on average.

First: "Always keep your face clean above the beard line, using a regular shaving razor (such as Harry's The Winston) or even a straight blade (like Baxter of California Blue Steel "Not a Replica" Straight Razor) at the barbershop," she says. "This also goes for your neckline."

As for preserving the beard shape, Machado recommends combing it into place, then using a standard beard trimmer (try Wahl Beard Cord / Cordless Rechargeable Trimmer) to graze any stray hairs. You can also employ some small, precise facial hair scissors (like Twees Stainless Steel Moustache Scissors) for the task. She then advises using beard oil (like Old Spice Beard Oil) to keep your whiskers hydrated, soft, and with a healthy dose of shine

T3 PROS: HOW TO WASH YOUR HAIR

You've been washing your hair for years, but you might be doing it wrong. We asked our T3 Pros for tips on how to wash your hair – the correct way.



Jessica Elbaum, T3Pro

"Correctly washing and conditioning your hair is very important. I usually tell my clients to wash & condition every other day unless they have dry texture. In that case one a week is fine. You should always start with a shampoo that's right for your hair texture. Lather up and rinse, add conditioner to smooth the cuticle and detangle. I highly recommend the T3 Source Shower Head, it gives you the cleanest water possible which makes a big difference in your hair and skin's texture and shine."

Marissa Machado, T3Pro

"Washing our hair is something we do on autopilot, the truth is most of us are doing it incorrectly. Rather than aggressively scrubbing your head it is best to lay your head back and let the water rinse through thoroughly."

Amy Komorowski, T3Pro

"Great hairstyling begins with a proper wash. I'm a big proponent of washing and conditioning hair everyday especially if you are active, work out and in the summer months. If your hair is especially coarse, curly or thick a good rinse and conditioner is all you might need to tame your hair. Get hair wet and use a small amount of shampoo focusing mostly at the roots. Add water to emulsify, make sure to rinse very well. Add conditioner to the ends of the hair and let sit for 1-2 minutes. When I style hair on set I've always tried to use filtered water or spray water like Evian to prep. This is why I'm excited about the T3 Source Shower Head because it filters out harmful chemicals and chlorine, making your hair shinier and the end result—more beautiful hair."

Michelangelo Arevalo, T3Pro

"Your hair should be rinsed in lukewarm water before it is washed in order to loosen the oil and dirt on your scalp. Depending on how much hair you have, you should be shampooing twice a week. The key is to alternate between two different types of shampoo to clarify and cleanse the hair shaft. It's important to invest in a good shampoo. Instead of conditioning, I think it's better to use a masque, comb it through the hair with the wet brush, letting it absorb for a few minutes, then wash it out completely. Additionally, the minerals in our shower water can be so intense on our hair."

How to Get Nick Jonas's Haircut from the Met Gala





We're calling it Hipster Roman Emperor.

Nick Jonas rode the subway to the Met Gala. Big deal. I ride the subway all the time

Nick Jonas's haircut, on the other hand—which we're thinking about calling Hipster Roman Emperor is pretty cool.

As a men's grooming writer, the Met Gala is typically less of an event for me than it is for our style writers, and much less so than any women's fashion journos out there.

But there are usually a couple guys whose grooming game is worth some press—and even then, it's rarely on theme. This year, that theme was "Heavenly Bodies:

Fashion and the Catholic Imagination", and I certainly didn't expect to see any Francis of Assisi-esque head donuts. I did expect Jared Leto to go full Gueci Jesus (which he did), but it was Nick Jonas who ascended to grooming heavens this year. He looked the most Roman of them all, and I am promptly taking this photo to the barbershop for an immediate copycatting.

It's just so clean and so perfectly blended, and the forehead fringe is so wonderfully askew. Jonas was cut by his longtime barber Ronnie McCoy III and groomed by the team at V76 for the event—specifically by Marissi Machado. Here's what Machado did to give him the best-groomed, and most on-theme look of the night (sorry, Leto).

What to tell the barber:

"To get the Nick Jonas haircut, tell your barber you want an extremely tight fade with hard edges," says Machado. This look is supposed to feel edgy." (No pun intended alongside those hard edges weighted at the crown.) "He or she should go guard-free on the bottom, from the neckline up to where the line starts to fade. Then go into a 1-guard while blending into the fade. The top is a scissor cut to create texture."

What kind of hair does this look work for?

"This style works great on guys with thick, straight, or wavy hair. Nick has very thick hair that actually had to be cut into a bit for a choppy look." (Your barber may need to texturize your hair too, to help it lay flat.)

What if a guy has a receding hairline?

"He can ask his barber to leave the side edges a bit longer and style with a more forward look for a bit of added coverage," says Machado.

How to style the look:

"To style this look, spray a hair tonic in wet hair to nourish the hair and prepare it for styling," Machado says. (The tonic is like a conditioner that helps the hair absorb and magnify the effectiveness of the styler.)

"Next, blow dry hair to create some texture." Pat it into place as it dries, so it isn't too blown out.

"Finish with a clay pomade. Work the product deep into the root so it really takes hold to the hair, and then work into to desired shape."

How often do you need to cut it or touch it up?

"This style needs up keep," says Machado. The short faded sides need to stay short, and the top can't get too bulky. "Get ready to see your barber every 10-12 days," she warns. "However, it is easy to grow into a less severe fade if you aren't looking for the commitment."

Here, we caught up with four stylists—plus, the men they make glow—to hear more about what goes on behind the scenes when guys get ready for the cameras. From the TMI (nose hair trimming) to stuff that'll truly make you jealous (La Mer regimens), these routines might not be fraction of what most of us go through on a given day, but they sure are fascinating.

Groomer Kim Verbeck, 46, and actor Jon Hamm, 45, started working together long before Don Draper was even a thing. "It was 2006, on an *Interview* magazine shoot, and *Mad Men* hadn't yet debuted," says Hamm. "Kimmy has been 'my people' ever since."

"I remember the third time we worked together," says groomer Marissa Machado, 33, of Bleed for This actor Miles Teller, 29, "It was for 21 & Over, and I came in the room and said, 'Nice to see you,' and he goes, 'So, are you, like, my girl now?" Miles Teller: The Oscars [in 2015, for Whiplash]. Dug it.

Marissa Machado: Oh my God, yes! But that was a stressful situation. It was Miles' first time attending, so he had a few nerves, as did I! We had a few disagreements, a slight panic, but in the end we worked it out: structured hair—a big movie star moment.

GLAMOUR: Any red-carpet hacks? Self-tanner a yes or no?

MT: I'd say yes. Because you can feel like shit, and everyone is like, "Oh my God, you look amazing!"






The Trick to Kit Harington's Perfectly Groomed Hair



There are no *Game of Thrones* spoilers ahead because this is about hair. In all of Westeros, nobody has a better mane than Jon Snow, not even the Lannisters, who fancy themselves lions. In the actual real world, the same is true of Kit Harington, who plays Jon Snow. It's a tough 'do to emulate unless you're genetically blessed with long flowing curly locks. Even so, we rang up celebrity hairstylist Marissa Machado to see what the deal is.

She first confirmed for us that Kit probably doesn't do too much to get his easy flowing locks, "Kit's hair is really naturally curly. It dries like that." Bummer for us dudes with wavy and/or straight hair, but there is hope! "When the hair is wet, you'll wanna go through it with a product like Kevin Murphy's Motion Lotion. It enhances curls. Get it through from root to end." Marissa then told us the best course of action would be to blow dry it on low with a "hot sock," which she describes this as a sort of sock-like fabric that goes over the end of your blow dryer to control air and temperature. While blowdrying, use your fingers to twirl strands and get that curling action going. Once you're dry, work some styling paste (she suggests Kevin Murphy's Undressed) into your hands and start shaping the hair around your face. Marissa tells us that it's all about time and effort here and that this isn't something you can just do casually on your way out.

If you're a guy with curly Jon Snow-like hair, but are looking for the right cut, Marissa cautions against going to a regular barber. "With curly hair, you really want to stick with somebody who cuts in a salon, somebody that knows how to cut curls specifically." Sometimes you've gotta go to great lengths for great locks.
