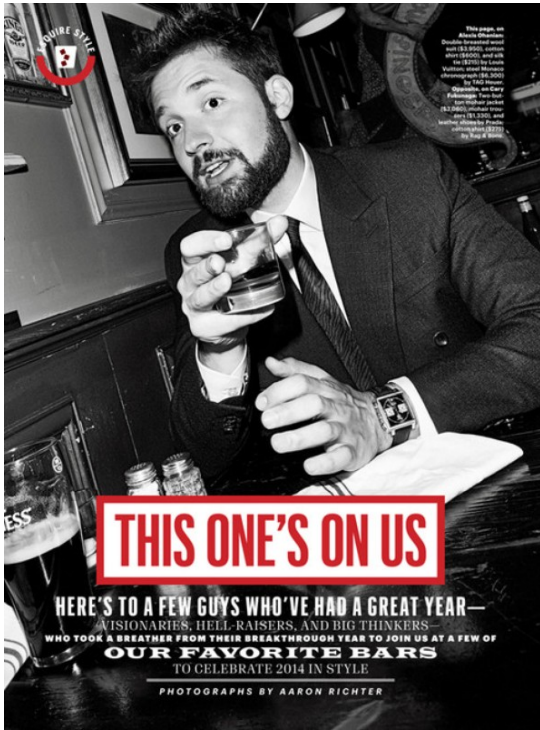

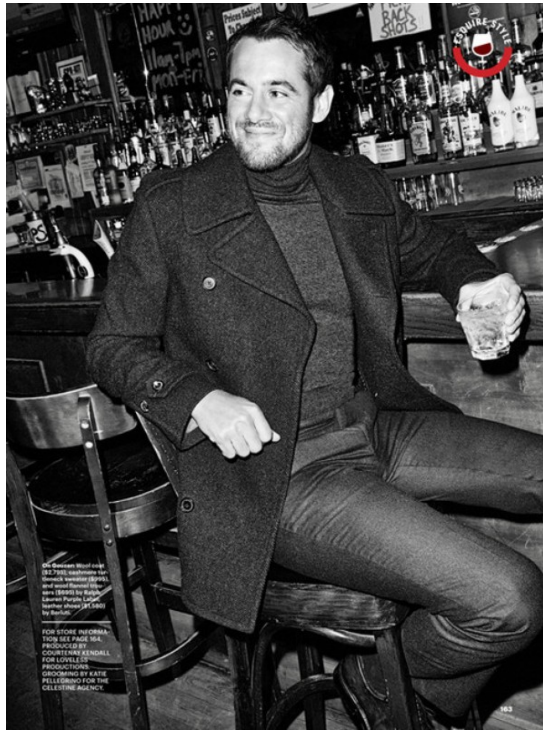

The Car Commute

More than 86 percent of us drive to work, and our average commute lasts 15 to 18 minutes. That's plenty of time to mess up your look. These upgrades, which use fabrics designed to move without wrinkling, keep that car from athletic apparel, but they're made for business.

1/ YOUR SHIRT
The four-way stretch is great, but it's this shirt's wicking properties that'll save your silhouette. Linen cotton, which leaves you feeling comfy when you're on the go, this fabric moves moisture away from your skin. So if you're sweating, that perspiration the group will never know it.

2/ YOUR PANTS
The cotton twill fabric is blended with 3 percent Lycra to give these pants extra mobility—a bonus, whether you're driving to work or taking it. The stretch design also features a side zip pocket to keep keys and coins from showing the pavement.

3/ YOUR SHOES
Socks made from synthetic blends, like those containing nylon and polyester, effectively wick away sweat, and spacer can options to any size foot.

NO PHONE LEFT BEHIND

If your worst travels might mean putting your pocket—and resulting in a lost phone—this is a great idea. You'll want to buy a device that's ready for anything. If you wonder how far from your phone, the Ring device has a built-in device flasher and helps you find your phone in a 100-foot radius. You'll also like you answer incoming calls with a single touch, and the built-in speaker and microphone allow you to keep talking while 30 feet of your phone.

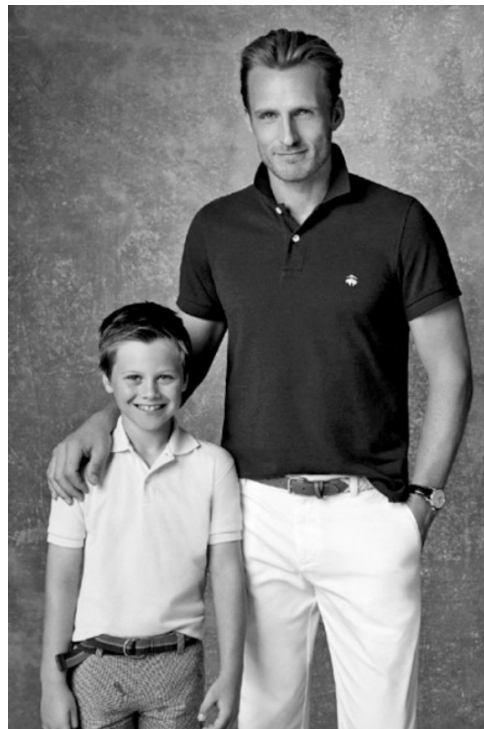
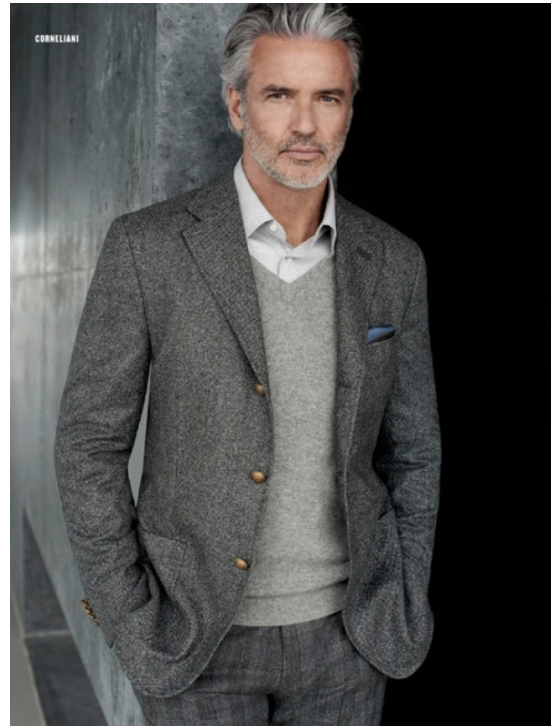
My Plan

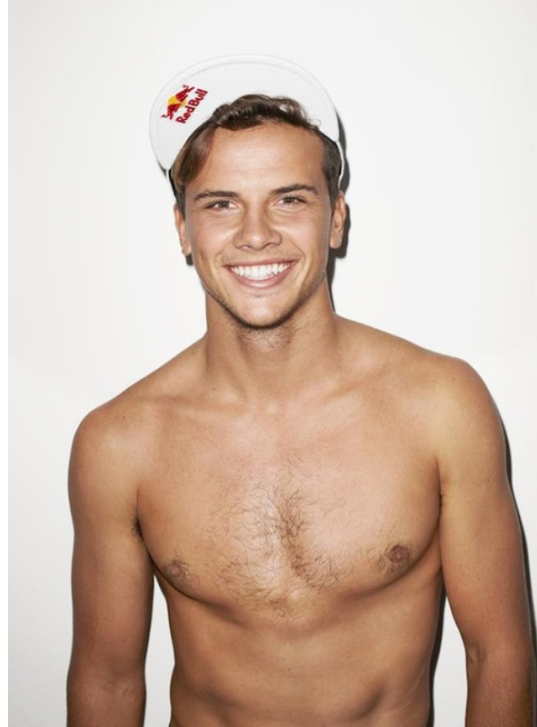
