Funny Side Up Tig Notaro turned a health crisis into an iconic comedy set. Now what? *By Kyle Anderson*

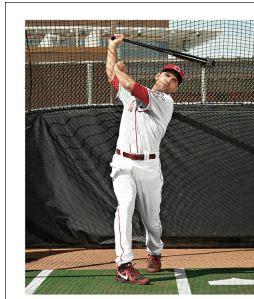
