5 Ways to Adjust to a New Zone

Time traveling? No problem. Writer Michael Williams explains how he syncs with the sun—wherever it rises.

Everyone—including NASA—has jet lag advice. I fly 125,000-plus miles a year, including overseas, and still go straight into a full day of meetings rested and ready.

1/ Plane time is sleep time. Nap as much as you can on board, in both directions. Don't try to eat bad food or watch bad movies. Sit by the window so seatmates don't bother you. Use an eye mask and noise-canceling headphones. Wheels up, eyes closed.

2/ Drink up. Stay hydrated. That means no alcohol, which will only make you dehydrated and groggy and rob you of relaxing sleep. You don't want to land hungover without the bonus of having earned it with a wild night out.

3/ Make the first day work. Assume local time immediately and fight to stay awake as long as you can. The longer you make it, the easier the transition.

4/ Step away from the bed. If you're in your hotel and it's not close to nighttime: *Never sit on the bed.* If you do, you're done.

5/ Return home right. Force yourself onto your normal schedule. The longer you allow yourself to stay in another time zone, the longer you miss out on life at home.


