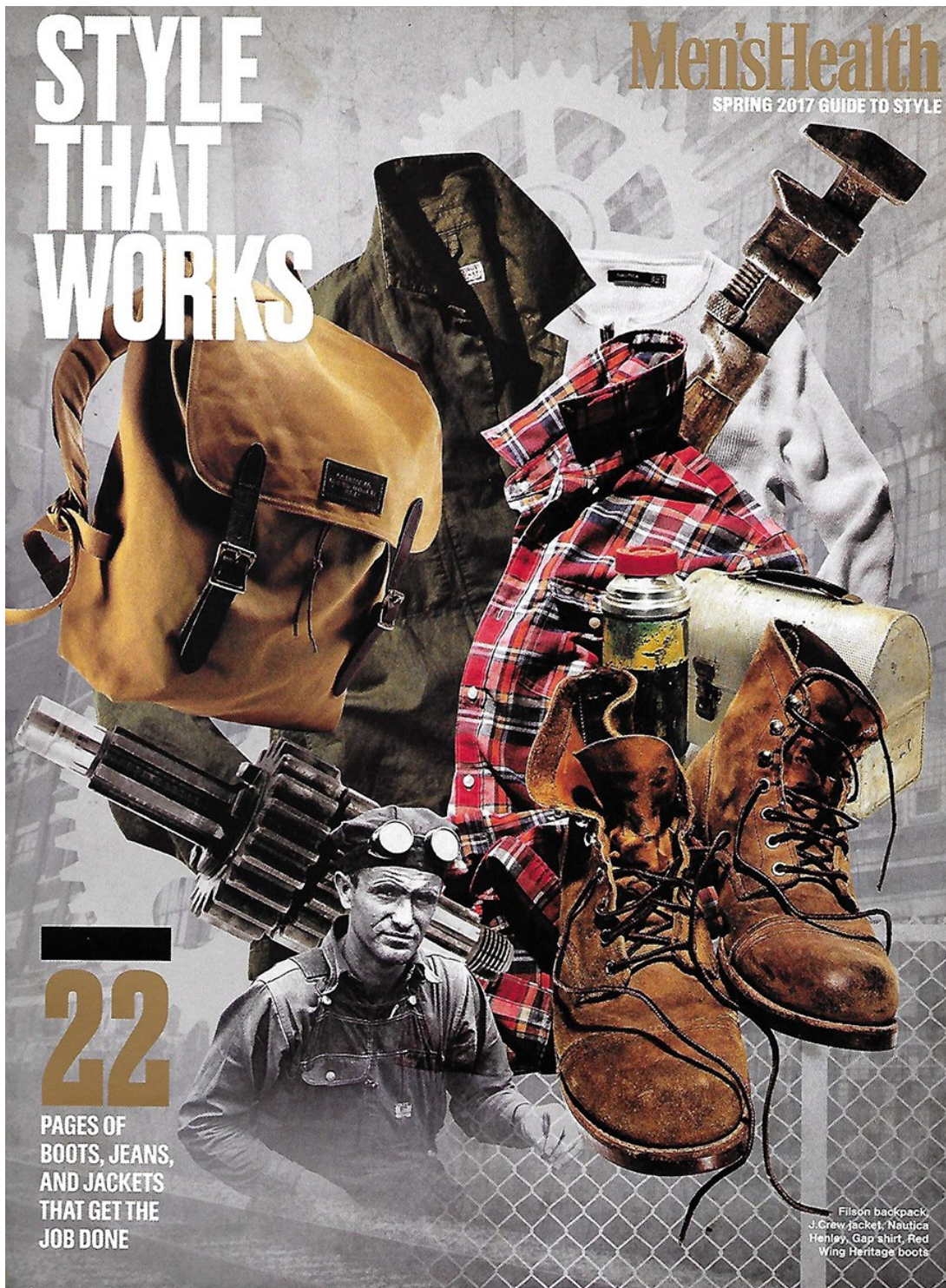

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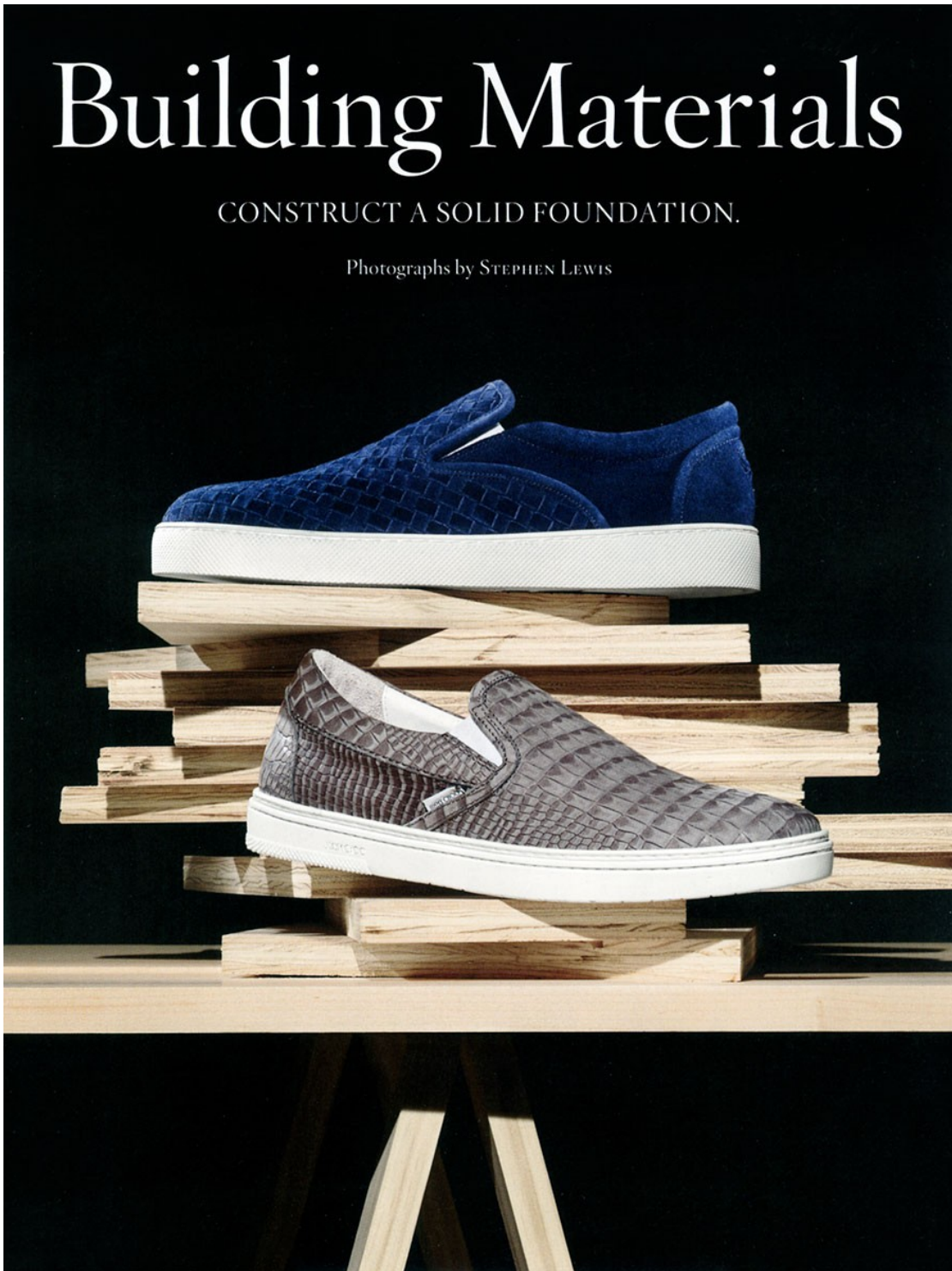

WHEN RAF SIMONS SHOWED HIS FIRST men's and women's collections for Jil Sander, in 2006, the fortunes of the beleaguered fashion house changed dramatically. It was obvious that while the Belgian designer understood Sander's minimalist aesthetic completely, he would never merely reproduce it or, worse, reduce it to pastiche. His Jil Sander Spring 2007 men's collection, shown here, expands on that understanding, creating coolly elegant, sexily understated clothing and accessories that unmistakably evoke Sander while remaining confidently Simons.

IF YOUR STYLE IS BOHEMIAN...

ADD A LITTLE STRUCTURE

You love long, flowy skirts, ethnic jewelry, fringed bags, and chunky sandals. But sometimes too much of that sort of thing goes too far...out. Slip on a tailored blazer and a straightforward tee and your beloved hippie style fast-forwards to the 21st century, looking completely fresh and smart.

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IF YOUR STYLE IS MINIMALIST...
ADD SOME TEXTURE

There are still plenty of clean lines and graphic shapes here to keep a less-is-more fanatic happy. Yet the tactile quality of these sleek and simple silhouettes gives the outfit new depth: Note the tweedy zigzag overlay on the bottom half of the dress, the blocky necklace, and the contrasting bangles (one matte, one shiny).

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IF YOUR STYLE IS VINTAGE...
ADD SOME MODERN TO THE RETRO

The trick is not to be so literal—you don't want to look as if you just walked off the set of *Mad Men*. Contrast "old" (estate jewelry, a Peter Pan collar shirt, and Mary Janes) with "new" (a glitzy loose dress, a cross-body bag, and a wraparound belt).
